Why Water?

Safe and abundant water in a community means better health, better crops, better nutrition, and better quality of life. Water is Life Water changes everything.

Water Facts

*Lots of water on Earth, right? Think again. 97% is salt water found in oceans. 2% is frozen in the polar ice and glaciers, and only 1% is accessible for practical and safe usage.

*Globally, 1.8 billion people – **one out of every four people** – drink from contaminated water sources.

*Unsafe water claims the lives of 840,000 people each year, half are children under five.

*2.5 billion people live without basic sanitation.

*On average, women in Sub-Saharan Africa walk 3.7 miles each day to fetch water. The traditional five-gallon jug used weighs 40 pounds when full!

*Average water consumption in the U.S. is around 156 gallons per day per person. In France - 77 gallons per day, in India - 38 per day, in Mali – only 3 gallons per day.
